Our guest speaker for June was Heather McCain of Citizens for Accessible Neighbourhoods (CAN). She gave a very comprehensive presentation and had a good discussion engaging with the Action Team's questions.

Car Free Day: Mehak, Sharnelle, Saguna, and Omar went to Car Free Day with the new outreach materials. It worked pretty well and had a nice flow to it moving from the spinning wheel to the "Price is Wrong" game to the jars to the stamp to the books and the book list. A big flaw is that the Price is Wrong prices were underestimated because when we were dealing with the welfare rate they were still too expensive, but when we used the spinning wheel to determine other incomes (disability, minimum wage, living wage etc) it became important to have more accurate numbers. Omar has updated them.

Poverty Mythbusters: The video on welfare access got an extra boost, when it was largely described in a Stephen Hume video.
