- Due to all the political activity, the BCPRC is meeting once a month instead of once every two
 months.

 of having a government that says it wants to implement a poverty reduction plan. We also had a

- Next steps: an initial version of the questionnaire; brainstorm places to go; mapping out where to go and when;
